

A Journey of Freedom

My name is Carol, and I am a graduate of the Women's Refuge program. After completing the internship in 2019, I was honored to join the staff as bookkeeper and complete the biblical counseling course. It's a privilege to share the comfort I've received as a graduate from the program with others.

My journey here began in the depths of grief. In 2009, I came to the Refuge just six months after losing my 17-year-old daughter, Caristina, in a car accident. It was my second devastating loss—my 11-year-old son, Matthew, had died tragically in 1997. I couldn't understand how God could allow this kind of suffering twice. I was angry, full of doubt, and drowning in self-pity.

Psalm 88 speaks of a darkness that feels allconsuming, ending with the words, "Darkness is my closest friend." But in its hopelessness, that psalm reminds us that God meets us there. He doesn't turn away from our grief—He enters into it with us.

At the Refuge, I found believers who were willing to walk with me, to shoulder my sorrow, and to remind me that healing is possible. Through biblical counseling, I learned to grieve with faith—to cry out to God with honest emotion (Psalm 13), resist doubt (1 Timothy 2:8), and lean into spiritual habits that sustain (2 Timothy 3:14–15). Grieving God's way is not about avoiding pain, but about trusting Him through it.

The comfort God has given me is not only a healing balm—it's a calling. Now, I walk with others through their pain, pointing them to the same hope I've found. At the Women's Refuge, our mission is help, hope, and healing. That mission is real. It's personal. And today, I can say this:
