From Rescue to Redemption

Growing up, God's name was spoken, but His love was not felt. Legalism ruled my life. I was raised to stay on God's good side, constantly fearing His wrath. I experienced all types of abuse at the hands of my mother. The person who was supposed to love, protect, and nurture became an instrument of fear, punishment, and control. I learned to see God through that same lens. And while I called myself a Christian, I would have summed up my walk with the Lord as a duty to do right and judge those who did wrong.

As a teenager, I got a glimpse into a different type of faith. Reading the Bible, I learned about grace; something different from the twisting of Scripture I heard at home. God gave me courage to share about the abuse my siblings and I endured. Child protective services became involved, and I went to live with another family at 17 years old. I left my siblings behind, something that I had dreaded from the moment I spoke up and carried the guilt for years. Though I tried to stay in contact with them, my mother kept me from speaking to them. Because my role as a big sister was stripped away, I didn't know who I was or what my purpose could be. My college roommate told me about the Refuge along with how it had changed her and her sister's lives. Could it have the same effect on me?

I first came to the Refuge in 2019. God worked wonderfully in those two weeks and showed me how much I needed Him. Later, I returned to complete the three-month program and found a level of healing that I didn't know was possible. I took an honest look at what I had endured, rather than trying to hide it away or cover it with spiritual platitudes. I realized my desires for love, affection and safety were meant to be fulfilled ultimately through Christ.

Finally, I began to feel the Lord more fully. I now saw Him as the Good Shepherd who loved me dearly, whose heart broke with mine over the injustice in the world. The Refuge helped me to realize that while God does orchestrate trials to refine us, our good and His glory are always at the center.

Complete surrender to God felt like the scariest thing I could do. However, with the support of the Womens Refuge, I made that step towards trusting God as He wrote my story. My healing has not been perfectly linear. Like most survivors of abuse, I have had ups and downs, relapses, and victories. I now work as a nurse in Virginia. I'm writing a book about my journey to freedom and am involved in helping children in the foster care system. The Lord brought redemption and beauty from the brokenness. I am thankful He has restored my relationship with many of my siblings, as well as my biological father. If you are reading this and wondering if you too can find healing, the answer is yes. Believing in Jesus doesn't

make all your problems go away. But you will never again be alone in your pain. God tells us clearly in Scripture that no one is too far gone. I am proof of that, and you can be too. While you are still breathing, there is still time for hope. Would you consider surrendering today?

While Mark and I sought counseling at the Refuge, our counselor guided us through some very painful childhood memories. After learning what God's meaning of forgiveness was, we were able to forgive the people who have hurt us in our past We also recognized that those childhood hurts were carried into our 47-year marriage and we needed to forgive each other. That's when the work really began!

Mark and I learned what the gospel says about trauma. We're learning how to address brokenness and find healing, God's purpose for marriage, steps to resolving conflict and how to communicate more effectively in marriage.

The most powerful and hardest thing for me to accept was "Who am I" in Christ. I couldn't trust anyone and had no close friends I could confide in. I realized that I didn't even know how to describe

what feelings I had because I was too busy trying to survive and raise our family. What I have gained so far with biblical counseling at the Refuge is I have no secrets from Mark, I am able to trust him more, and he is now the best friend I have always wanted.

Mark learned that his severe emotional and physical abusive childhood drove his alcohol and drug addictions for 60 years. He has gained freedom in Christ and knows his Heavenly Father loves him. Our marriage is the healthiest it has ever been after a lot of hard work together with the Refuge.
