God reins us in to reveal to us when we willfully are "standing up on the inside," and to give us opportunity to yield to Him.

God, our gracious and generous Lord, rains His blessings upon us. From Ezekiel 34:26, "*I will send down showers in season; there will be showers of blessing*." The Israelites were known for their forgetfulness of God's blessings towards them and they became ungrateful. When we intentionally remember the many specific ways God has blessed us, we reap thankful hearts.

By resting in, remembering and delighting in who God is, we celebrate and worship God. That is why we

were created for Isaiah 43:21 reads, "I have made these people for Myself, that they may proclaim My praise.
